Cablecom expands Fiber Power services to the city of St. Gallen

After Zurich, Bern and Winterthur, also the city of St. Gallen can now enjoy the Fiber Power services offered by cablecom. Fiber Power is the next generation of high-speed Internet and offers download speeds of up to 100 Mbit/s and higher upload volumes. Cablecom customers can now surf the net up to five times faster than with the quickest DSL providers. Fiber Power is currently available to almost 50% of Swiss households with cablecom connections; most of the remaining households will have access by the end of 2010.

High-definition live streams, multimedia downloads or online games: the growth of information and data volumes in the Internet continues unabated as its use intensifies. Cablecom is meeting customer needs by presenting the next generation of data transmission: Fiber Power internet – the fastest Internet in Switzerland – with transmission rates of up to 100 Mbit/s.

Cablecom is now launching three offers, which have already been available in Zurich, Berne and Winterthur since September of 2009, in the city of St. Gallen as well:

- **Fiber Power internet 100** (100 000 Kbit/s download/7000 Kbit/s upload for CHF 95),
- **Fiber Power internet 50** (50 000 Kbit/s download/5000 Kbit/s upload for CHF 85) and
- **Fiber Power internet 10+** (10 000 Kbit/s download/5000 Kbit/s upload for CHF 59).

These are ideal speeds for simultaneous, multimedia applications such as video on demand, video telephony, music downloads or online gaming. It also works perfectly when using several home PCs to surf the net simultaneously.

Cablecom is realising the next generation of high-speed broadband by using new technologies (Docsis 3.0) and continually extending its own network. «In the past four years we have invested over one billion Swiss francs to make the Fiber Power extension possible. The result is a high-quality, future-proof network, 95% of which currently consists of optical fibres, that has the flexibility to meet increasing demand», says cablecom Managing Director Eric Tvetter.

Fast, easy and available immediately

New customers will receive a new, modified modem when they order the Fiber Power internet service. This modem can be directly connected to the cabling outlet in the building and/or in the apartment. No extra adaptations on an infrastructural level or additional investments are necessary. Existing hispeed customers who switch to Fiber Power internet will be given the new device.
