Cablecom business implements gigabit data network for Diagnostic Centers of the RODIAG Group

At the end of June 2010 cablecom business signed a contract for the construction and operation of a high-speed network with the RODIAG Group, which specializes in radio diagnostics. This network is designed to link the RODIAG sites in the north and east of Switzerland. From this autumn it will be possible for data to be exchanged in the new optical fibre corporate network at rates of up to 1,000 Mbit/s.

The RODIAG Group (http://www.rodiag.ch) will soon have one of the fastest data networks in the healthcare sector. This high-speed network will enable radiologists in the ten RODIAG Diagnostic Centers to collaborate across sites in real time. All ten sites will be linked together with bandwidths of up to 1 Gbit/s.

New basic infrastructure

The new WAN platform at the same time forms the basis for a modern data management system centred on the digital preparation and post-processing of x-ray images, and on efficient online dialogue with hospitals and doctors' practices. The RODIAG Group is actually on the verge of introducing new solutions in the field of radiological information (RIS) and image archiving (PACS) – (RIS/PACS for short). Since diagnostic imaging procedures generate large quantities of data, the data network must have correspondingly high capacities. With the high-availability broadband network from cablecom, all RODIAG sites will be able to take full advantage of the new RIS/PACS solution right from the start.

The high-availability WAN solutions from cablecom are meeting with a great deal of interest in industries with particularly high quality requirements. Now that one in two cantonal banks transports its data on the cablecom platform, the healthcare sector is also increasingly putting its trust in cablecom.
