Cablecom extends Fiber Power to Lucerne and Biel

After Zurich, Berne, Winterthur, St.Gallen and certain regions of western Switzerland, Lucerne and Biel are now also able to enjoy the Fiber Power services from cablecom. With Fiber Power internet, the latest generation cable network, cablecom is bringing lightning-fast Internet to the home. With download speeds of up to 100 Mbit/s and super-fast uploads. Cablecom customers can now surf the net up to five times faster than with the quickest DSL providers using the existing cable connection. Fiber Power is now already available to over 50 percent of all households throughout Switzerland that are connected to cablecom.

High-definition live streams, multimedia downloads or online games: the growth of information and data volumes in the Internet continues unabated as its use intensifies. Cablecom is meeting customer needs by presenting the next generation of data transmission: Fiber Power internet – cablecom's fastest internet connection – with transmission rates of up to 100 Mbit/s. Cablecom has recently launched the following two offers in Lucerne and Biel, which have been made available in Zurich, Berne, Winterthur, St.Gallen and certain regions of western Switzerland, starting September 2009:

- **Fiber Power internet 100** (100,000 Kbit/s download/7,000 Kbit/s upload for 85 Swiss francs)
- **Fiber Power internet 50** (50,000 Kbit/s download/5,000 Kbit/s upload for 60 Swiss francs)

These are ideal speeds for simultaneous, multimedia applications such as video on demand, video telephony, music downloads or online gaming. It also works perfectly when using several home PCs to surf the net simultaneously.

Cablecom is implementing the latest generation of high-speed broadband by using new technologies (Docsis 3.0) and continually extending its own network. "In the past four years we have invested over one billion Swiss francs to make the Fiber Power expansion possible.



The result is a high-quality, future-proof network, 95% of which currently consists of optical fibres, that has the flexibility to meet increasing demand", says cablecom Managing Director Eric Tveter. "Cablecom now has a network that offers speeds other providers would need years of investments to achieve."

The modem simply plugs into the existing cable connection, and it's done. No further installation, construction work or investment.
